## Spiritual Emphasis

David Trim, Ph.D., F.R.Hist.S.



Dr David Trim is Director of Archives, Statistics, and Research at the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. He was born in Bombay, India, to missionary parents; raised in Sydney, Australia; and completed his education in England. He holds a BA in History from Newbold College and a PhD in History from King's College, University of London. He served ten years on the faculty at Newbold College, teaching history and religion, and two years at Pacific Union College in California where he held the Walter C. Utt Chair of History. He was called to the General Conference in October 2010. He is the first Seventh-day Adventist to be elected a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society, is an adjunct professor at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary, at Andrews University, and is the editor or co-author of ten books and many scholarly articles. A citizen of both the UK and Australia, he is married to Wendy, a California native, and has one daughter, Genevieve.

#### "Going into all the world: how the Adventist Church went global"

Mark 16: 15-16, 19-20

Friday Vespers: Today, the worldwide nature of the Seventh-day Adventist Church is one of its most distinctive characteristics. Yet early Adventists believed that God did not call them to work anywhere except in North America! Gradually, that changed, as they came to understand that the great commission and Revelation 14 really mean "all the world" and "all people". At a time when Seventh-day Adventists are beginning to think locally rather than globally, and to focus internally more than on mission, the early debate among our pioneers about the nature of mission has much still to teach us.

Matthew 14:13-21

Sabbath sermon: The gospel and Ellen White both set out very clearly how Jesus reached people of His day. In our own day, in our own country, where society is highly secular, old methods of evangelism are increasingly unsuccessful. A return to Christ's method of reaching people offers a way forward, but it requires us to be actively involved in our communities and to have compassion on people, as Christ did.

## THE NEIGHBORHOOD AND THINGS NEARBY

### Washington Marriott, Georgetown

Steps away from two Metro stops and a short walk to both Dupont Circle and Georgetown, the Washington Marriott Georgetown offers a convenient location for exploring popular neighborhoods and attractions, including Foggy Bottom, Georgetown and George Washington University.

#### Georgetown

The perfect blend of old and new, Georgetown is teeming with charm, from cobblestone streets and federalist architecture to boutique shopping and ethnic dining—140 restaurants and gourmet shops from more than 50 ethnic cuisines.

#### Foggy Bottom Neighborhood

Named for the fog that used to roll off of the Potomac River, this polished neighborhood is home to luxury hotels, cultural institutions, medical and government offices and inviting outdoor spaces. Foggy Bottom's top landmarks include: *George Washington University, John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and the US Department of State.*

#### Dumbarton Oaks Park

Dumbarton Oaks Park is an exceptionally significant historic landscape, where the naturalistic gardens and built features offer a very special experience to those who visit. Today, there are two main divisions to the gardens: the formal gardens owned and maintained by Harvard University; and the naturalistic garden that is Dumbarton Oaks Park. These two parts are connected, a unified design where one can view the woodland of the park from the upper gardens.

#### Meridian Hill Park

Contains the only Presidential Memorial in Washington D.C. to the 15th President of the United States James Buchanan.

#### The Old Stone House

The oldest building in DC, Old Stone House, built in 1765, commemorates the daily lives of Georgetown's early residents. The house is a great example of Revolutionary War-era architecture.

#### Francis Scott Key Memorial Park

The small but formal park and memorial includes a bronze bust of Francis Scott Key, wayside exhibits explaining his story, and an American flag depicting the year 1814 when Key penned his now famous poem. Author of the Star Spangled Banner, Francis Scott Key and his family lived in a house practically bordering the contemporary memorial from circa 1805 to 1830.

#### Dupont Circle Neighborhood

One of DC's trendiest neighborhoods is just a 2-minute walk from the Washington Marriott Georgetown. A hub of activity, Dupont Circle is home to historic residences, ethnic restaurants, art galleries, and foreign embassies.

#### The Peirce Mill and Estate

Peirce Mill was built in the 1820's, and operated commercially until 1897. Peirce Mill has recently been refurbished and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

#### Hiking Trails

There are over 32 miles of trails in Rock Creek Park. The two primary trails include the green-blazed Western Ridge Trail, which parallels the western side of the park, and the blue-blazed Valley Trail.
