During this presentation the treatment sequence in the application of digital work flow for dental implant surgery and implant prosthodontics will be outlined, identifying the elements that make these procedures practical and predictable in the treatment of patients with dental implants.


El Yunque Rainforest tour

Discover El Yunque Rain Forest with its beautiful giant ferns, plants, and wildlife. Take in La Coca Waterfall, El Mirador or the Yokahu Observation Tower, and enjoy a swim in La Barrigona River. Named after the good Indian spirit, Yuquiyu, and shelter to the Carib Indians for 200 years, El Yunque is the only tropical rainforest in the U.S. National Forest System. Spanning 28,000 acres and reaching an elevation of 3,624 feet, the area receives over 100 billion gallons of rainfall each year.

In El Yunque you will see many unique sights and hear many unique sounds unsurpassed by any of the natural wonders. Breathtaking views of feathery ferns, thick ropelike vines, white tuberoses, ginger, miniature orchids and some 240 different species of trees are in abundance throughout the area. Home to the Puerto Rican parrot, El Yunque is also a bird sanctuary and you can hear the wondrous strains of these birds harmonizing with the tiny, inch-long coqui's prevalent to Puerto Rico. Splashing falls and cool shaded pools complement the total enhancement of the forest. Don't forget to bring your camera!!!









NASDAD and International Missions

Christians and Christian organization, naturally follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. The reflex to reach out to those in need is common in dental circles, and especially unadulterated in Christian dental circles. NASDAD is no exception; from the time that LLUSD became a reality until now NASDAD has been very active and collaborative with other organizations to spread the Good News and improve oral health around the world. We accept that there are 125 dental clinics around the world, run by some Adventist organizational entity but we don't often stop and consider what impact this loose affiliation has on the thousands of patients that are served each year. Similarly, we seldom stop and consider the impact that NASDAD has had on these clinics through the years.

The generous NASDAD donors have through the years been instrumental in establishing a number of these clinics in different parts of the world. Currently, we are collaborating with Adventist Health International, Waterloo Adventist Hospital, regional Church leadership, and the GC Health Ministries to establish another new dental clinic in Freetown, Sierra Leone. Similarly, we have recently helped establish new clinics in Windhoek, Namibia, at Nairobi Adventist Hospital, at Bongo Adventist Hospital in Angola, and on the Island of Grenada.

NASDAD has a robust dental equipment program in which we accept donated equipment and other items and then evaluate and maintain, as needed, equipment which is then shipped to mission clinics who need them. We have sent millions of dollars of equipment though the years.

The generous donors to NASDAD have supported clinics in many other ways, by helping to buy, repair, and maintain equipment, by advising on subjects from anesthesia, to office design, and by providing education to dentists who are involved in mission service. We have provided subsidies for dental staff during the COVID pandemic so experienced teams could remain together and programs could continue, and over the years NASDAD volunteers provided locum tenon coverage to many mission clinics. We support dental missions in a myriad of ways. It is in our DNA, it is a challenge, it is a joy, it is effective, and it is quite unfinished. Thank you for being a part of it!
