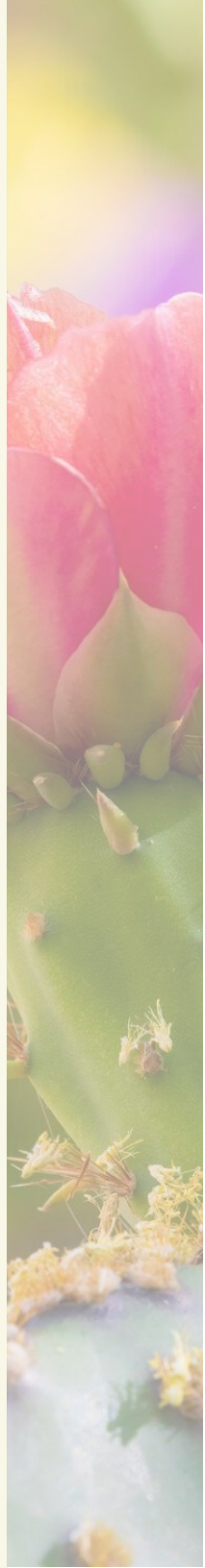

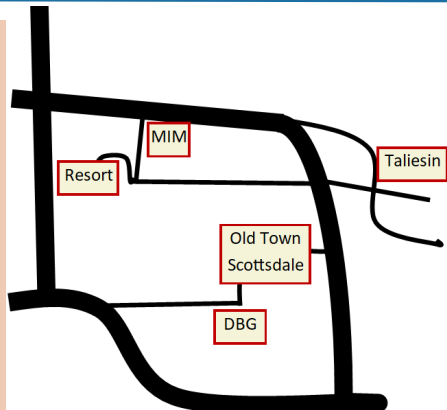

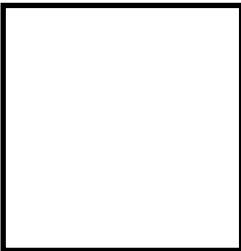
Our next group activity is stepping into nature exploring the botanical gardens.

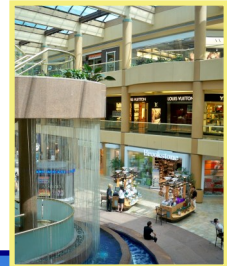

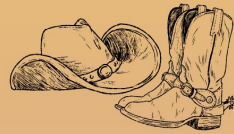

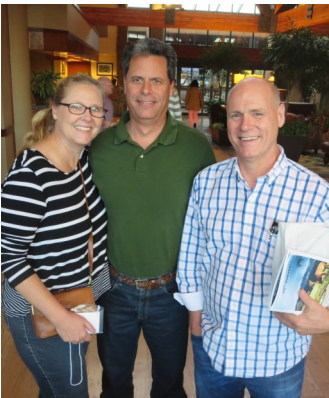
